



#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over time, the severe form of one-chance penance collapsed under lack of enthusiasm for its burdens and its public nature. As ordinary Christians prayed for the great sinners, it must have occurred to them that they were sinners no less, and they required a form of penance also. The Irish came to the rescue, never having had a public form of penance, but inventing a system called "tariff penance," which was completely private, available to everyone, and wildly popular. After a detailed confession, priest and penitent would lie on the floor before the altar and recite a number of psalms. The priest then pronounced a judgment, a tariff, giving a task or a prayer to complete before reconciliation.

The surviving guidebooks for confessors make for hair-raising reading as the sins of which the Irish people were supposedly capable were catalogued and keyed to penances. Cattle or sheep rustling might require stripping down to sing psalms in an icy brook, for example, or adultery could be the occasion for rolling in a thicket of thorns. All of this might have stayed in Ireland had not the monks had a desire to travel, blazing across Europe with their theology and their rituals, and their sense that Christians needed strong medicine for sin and the assurance of God's forgiveness.

# **NECESSARY REPETITION**

People complain that God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

# Social Justice Ministry

As Catholic we are called to reach out and to build relationships of love and justice. Catholic social teaching is based on, and inseparable from, our understanding of human life and human dignity. Vallejo's "Participatory Budget" will let residents (over age 16) have an opportunity to vote on how \$2.4 million tax dollars will be spent. The projects range from helping the homeless, to supporting our youth, to renovating buildings and fixing the streets. Project costs range from \$18,000 to \$1million. The money will be divided among the projects that receive the most votes.

The Social Justice Ministry urges you to review the 25 projects and pray for guidance when selecting your 5 votes. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, according to his position and role, in promoting the common good." We hope to get at least 2000 St. Basil parishioners to vote for projects that promote Catholic values and human dignity of the lowly. There will be dozens of satellite voting locations throughout Vallejo, Sept. 27th thru Oct. 6th. Or vote at Vallejo City Hall, weekdays from 12:00 noon - 7:00 p.m.

Common Ground Update - Did you ever wonder what happened to Common Ground after the Founding Convention? Well, we are planning a "Community Conversation Campaign". And we want to hear from you! What has been your experience or the experience of the people you care about accessing services in our community? Some of us face challenges with transportation, public safety, or finding the right resources for our children; others deal with housing, employment or immigration issues. We will listen to our shared experiences and stories so that we can organize the power to act.
